Dear Families,

We start every day at our morning meeting with a weather song.

What's the weather,

What's the weather,

What's the weather like today

Is it sunny or is it cloudy or is it raining out today.

Have the children look outside and tell you what they see.

Day and Night

-What happens in the daytime?

-What happens in the night?

Art activities:

Marble / golf ball Painting - Place paper in some sort of tray with edges or a shirt box. Put black or white paint into a plastic container. Add marbles or golf balls into the paint. It takes great concentration to spoon marbles or golf balls into the tray or box. Then tip the tray or box back and forth to move the marbles or golf balls around.

Potato Printing - Cut potato in half and then cut out star and moon shapes. Dip the potato into paint and press it onto paper.

Moon Craft - Draw a circle in the middle of a piece of blue or black paper. Take tin foil and scrunch it up. Dip the foil into white or gray paint. Stamp it into the circle to make craters.

Outdoor Play:

Have the children collect large rocks from outside. After the rocks are washed they can color them. Take the rocks outside and hide them. The children can go searching for the moon rocks.

Recipe:

Sunshine Breakfast Biscuits

1 package of refrigerator biscuits

Pat each biscuit into a 3" circle

Place on a greased cookie sheet

To make the rays of the sun press a plastic knife into the dough, not cutting through

Press thumb into the center of each biscuit and drop about 1/2 tsp of orange marmalade into depression.

Bake at 450 degrees for 6-8 minutes.
