Circle Ball Toss

If you have balls for playing you could tape circle cutouts on the wall at eye level and have your child throw the ball at the circles on the wall with the goal of hitting them. Even if they miss this is a great activity for hand-eye coordination foundations and gross motor skill development.



Circle Painting

Toilet paper rolls, empty cans, round cylinder containers, plastic cups or lids can be used for circle stamping art. See if you can find circles of different sizes. Your children will love dipping these items into paint!

Circle Paper Puzzle



Use painters tape or a round Tupperware container to trace circle outlines on colored paper. Cut the paper in half making two semi circles to match back together. For older children you could cut into thirds and/or fourths. You could also draw a smiley face- one circle could have blue eyes, one could have red eyes and the children have to match the smiley faces by color recognition once they are split in halves, thirds and/or fourths.

Make Homemade Bubbles: 4 cups warm water, ½ cup sugar, ½ cup blue Dawn dish soap.

Step #1. Whisk the sugar and water.

Whisk the sugar into the warm water until the sugar dissolves.

Step #2. Whisk in the soap.

Add the dish soap and whisk to combine.

Step #3. Let sit.

Letting the homemade bubbles sit for a couple of hours or even overnight helps them work a bit better, but is not strictly necessary.
